

Un-manned Satellites on Postage Stamps : 18

The Vanguard Series

This is the eighteenth in a series of articles about un-manned satellites on postage stamps. This article features the Vanguard-series satellites. Vanguard-1 was the second successful satellite launched by the U. S. on 17 March 1958, having been preceded by Explorer-1 launched on 31 January 1958. As mentioned in the Explorer-1 article in this series, Vanguard would have been the first U.S. satellite had there not been a failure of the first announced launch attempt in December of 1957. That failure allowed Explorer-1 to become the first successful U.S. satellite.

The Navy's Project Vanguard was one of many disappointments and embarrassments for the U.S. after the successful launch of both Sputnik-1 and Sputnik-2 by the Soviet Union in late 1957. A second Vanguard failed in February 1958 before the first successful Vanguard was launched. (By that time the second Explorer, Explorer-2, had been attempted, but failed to orbit.) Of the eleven Vanguard orbital attempts, only three Vanguards were launched successfully, all eight others were failures, in the years 1957 through 1959.

The Vanguard satellites look more like what one would expect of a satellite, rather than the rocket-like shape of the Explorer-1 satellite. Vanguards have basically spherical bodies with antennas that are attached perpendicular to the body, unlike the folded-back antennas on Sputnik-1 that appear to give it motion even in a static image. Each of the three successful Vanguards had a unique appearance, as can be seen in the reference images available on the Website developed by the authors. Both Vanguard-1 and 2 can be identified on many postal items. However there are a large number of items where the images are quite small and the identification is not entirely clear. These items are designated "like-Vanguard-2" in the checklist that accompanies this article, since they appear to have a body and antennas similar to those of Vanguard-2. Vanguard-3 is known to appear on only one postal item, a Souvenir Sheet issued by Chad in 1996 (*Michel* BL248).

Readers are referred to the authors' Website for reference images of the satellites in the Vanguard series, as well as images of launch covers and postal items that feature these satellites.
